

Cleaning Qualifications

CIWM (WAMITAB) Level 1 Award in Practical Cleaning Skills (refuse chutes)

About this qualification

This qualification supports individuals into work by providing the skills cleaning operatives require to prepare and clean refuse chutes using appropriate equipment and cleaning agents.

Level 1 occupations within the cleaning sector are supported by the CIWM suite of practical cleaning skills qualifications. Providing specialist skills to the recently unemployed, the long-term unemployed and individuals that are new to the employment market increases employment opportunities within this sector.

Who is it for?

- New entrants to the cleaning industry
- Long-term unemployed who wish to retrain
- Apprentices
- Experienced workers that want evidence of their skills

How is this qualification delivered?

This qualification is assessed in the workplace via portfolio of evidence.

What does this qualification cover?

To achieve this qualification, learners must complete two units. The learner will therefore need to complete all the mandatory units designed to ensure you:

- Can select and use appropriate personal protective equipment
- Can prepare cleaning agents and materials safely
- Can use cleaning equipment and machinery safely
- Can store cleaning agents, equipment and personal protective equipment correctly
- Can prepare work areas for cleaning by using hazard warning signs and ventilating areas
- Have the technical cleaning skills required to complete tasks

What are the entry requirements of this qualification?

This qualification is open entry. This means that learners interested in undertaking the CIWM (WAMITAB) Level 1 Award in Practical Cleaning Skills (refuse chutes) do not require any other qualifications or levels of attainment to take this qualification.

However, learners will need to be employed in a suitable position, or have access to the working environment, as the qualification is assessed 'on the job'.

What job role could this qualification lead to or support?

This qualification could have significant benefits for the cleaning workforce as it will act as a gateway to opportunities for career progression or further education by building the confidence of employees and demonstrating that their skills have value. This qualification is ideal for those employed in the following job roles:

- Domestic cleaning operative
- Commercial cleaning operative
- Industrial cleaning operative

What are the opportunities for progression to further learning?

Learners that are interested in advancing their careers through further education can go onto study several qualifications at a higher level, including: CIWM (WAMITAB) Level 2 Certificate in Cleaning and Support Services.
